

## **MEMBERSHIP - Individual Member**

Full 'Individual Membership' is open to any individual actively engaged in the conservation of monuments, groups of buildings or sites, or with expertise in one or more areas related to the aims of the association as defined in the ICOMOS Statutes Article 3

- as a member of the scientific, technical or administrative staff of a national, regional or local monuments, fine arts or antiquities service;
- as a decision-maker or as specialist engaged in the conservation, restoration, rehabilitation and enhancement of monuments, groups of buildings and sites.
- as an academic who has chosen a discipline in one of these areas of cultural heritage.

Full membership confers voting rights and eligibility to participate in National Scientific Committees.

A portion of the fees paid by a full member of ICOMOS Ireland is sent annually to ICOMOS International to support the international working of the organisation.

A discounted membership rate is available to applicants who are either under 30 years of age.

Membership of ICOMOS Ireland does not confer any professional accreditation and should not be used in this context.

### **Membership benefits**

- E-zine subscription with news and information about national and international activities, current heritage issues and employment opportunities.
- ICOMOS membership card, which can be used for discounted entry into cultural heritage sites and institutions around the world.
- Right to vote at ICOMOS Ireland meetings.
- Right to participate in international activities, international scientific committees and conferences
- Networking with heritage professionals
- Platform for contribution to evolving conservation good practice nationally and internationally.
- Regular formal presentations on issues relating to cultural heritage
- Affiliation with ICOMOS international, including right to record details with ICOMOS International Secretariat in Paris.



### **Application requirements**

Applicants must be able to demonstrate their interest in cultural heritage and have a CV which demonstrated that they are or have been working professionally in this area.

- A completed application form with nominations by two full members of ICOMOS Ireland,
- A full curriculum vitae, demonstrating at least three years professional and/or educational experience with a core focus on heritage conservation
- A personal statement of relevant professional experience, which includes your demonstrated willingness and ability to remain well informed concerning ICOMOS charters, doctrinal texts and principals, and the Ethical Statement.
- A brief (50 – 100 words) statement from one of your nominators supporting your application
- Confirmation the applicant has read, understood and commits to the Ethical Principles for ICOMOS Members.
